THE PROJECT

We are five schools from different parts of Europe-Czech Republic, Poland, Cyprus, Croatia and Spain- drawn together around a common aim. Our aim is to enhance the impact of modern ICT tools on the learning process and develop students' social skills.

The name of the project, "IT or not IT?"- Reaching our goals equipped with modern tools, highlights our main goal: to enhance the impact of modern technologies on students' learning and social skills development. All activities of the project are focused around these 5 key goals:

Durante las visitas escolares, los estudiantes participarán en diversos talleres, actividades sociales y de tiempo libre, incorporando las herramientas TIC. 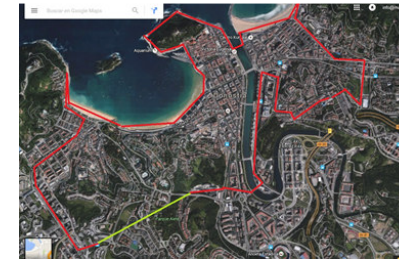

USEFUL INFORMATION ABOUT DONOSTIA – SAN SEBASTIÁN

Currency:	Euro, the EU currency.
Official languages:	Basque and Spanish.
Climate:	Mild, with generally gentle temperatures, high humidity, frequent clouds and heavy rainfall throughout the year. The coldest month is usually January, with an average temperature of 7.9°C and the hottest August, with an average of 20°C.

San Sebastián is a medium-sized city with almost 186,000 inhabitants. It is a tertiary, tourist city, eminently commercial, with strong emphasis on services and congresses. Its smart urban layout and short distances make San Sebastián perfect for getting around on foot, with sprawling pedestrian precincts bike lanes and promenades that hug the city coastline from tip to tip.

Basic Food

- Loaf of bread: 0,90€
- Milk: 0,50€ – 0,90€ (liter)
- Water: 0,60€ – 1,0€ (liter)

If you feel like going to a café/bar:

- A coffee can cost: 1,20€
- A soft drink: 2,50€
- A “pintxo”: 2,00€
- A sandwich: 4,50€
- And for lunch or dinner you can find menus from 12€

If you're going to the movies:

- Entry price (Monday - Friday): 8,50€
- Popcorn: 3,30€
